Dear Chevre,

Shana tova!

As I look back to the High Holidays, I feel so blessed to be welcomed into this community. Thank you to everyone who took time to introduce or reintroduce themselves to me during the holidays. I appreciate learning about the history of the congregation, hearing how each of you came to be a part of Temple Emanu-El, and discovering the many generations of personal connections in the community.

We have entered the week of Sukkot, a festival with many names. Sukkot is called the Feast of Ingathering, the Feast of Tabernacles or Booths, and it is called the Time of Our Joy. During the week of this pilgrimage and harvest festival, we are commanded to dwell in sukkot (singular: sukkah), booths or huts. The fragile nature of the sukkot reminds us of our own vulnerability and dependence on God's compassion and protection. These temporary dwellings allow us to reenact how our spiritual ancestors lived when they wandered in the wilderness and how, after settling the land, they would stay in the fields while harvesting their crops.

This year I am especially drawn to the name "the Feast of Ingathering." My family has a tradition of hosting a potluck get-together on the Saturday night of Sukkot. It is a wonderful opportunity for us to connect with friends and neighbors as we settle into the fall. As I watched Don put up the Temple Emanu-El sukkah, I thought about how to encourage people to visit and gather so that we can connect as we celebrate the holiday. Our religious school families will have started the ingathering of our community with Hot Dogs in the Hut by the time you read these words.

As we move away from the High Holidays and into fall, let's continue to find ways to gather together so that this new year will be filled with the blessings of loving community and joy.

All four sides of a sukkah are open, or easily opened, just like Abraham's tent, to welcome people to enter from wherever they come. This hospitality is a dominant theme of Sukkot. In that spirit, on October 3 at 6:30 pm, we will hold an Interfaith Sukkot Gathering potluck at which I hope to see many of our neighbors and you. The sukkah will remain available to everyone throughout the week of Sukkot (September 30–October 7). Consider meeting a friend or inviting a few people to have brunch or lunch in the sukkah. It also is a great time to connect with me. I plan to enjoy my lunch in the Temple Emanu-El sukkah at least on Tuesday, October 3, and Thursday,

October 5, and I invite you to join me then. Our Feast of Ingathering becomes the Time of Our Joy when we welcome each other into the sukkah and celebrate this holiday together as a community.

Speaking of community, I want to highlight a few events coming up on our calendar. On Saturday, October 7, at 7:00 pm, we will joyfully begin a new year of reading Torah as a community with singing and dancing at our Simchat Torah service, with music by Glenn Dickson and Michael McLaughlin of the Shirim Klezmer Orchestra. On Sunday, October 15, at 9:30 am, the Temple Emanu-El book group will meet, and author Elizabeth Graver will be coming in person to discuss her new novel, *Kantika*, a multigenerational saga based on the her family that takes us from Istanbul to Barcelona to Havana to New York. On Sunday, October 29, at 10:00 am, the Adult Education and Chesed Committees are cosponsoring the program "The Power of Listening/Presence," led by Mary Crowe, LICSW, from Care Dimensions. In addition to these events, we will have Shabbat morning services every Saturday at 9:30 am, followed by parasha study or Israel Chavurah. All of the programs, events, and gatherings at Temple Emanu-El offer the opportunity to create and nurture the relationships which sustain our holy congregation.

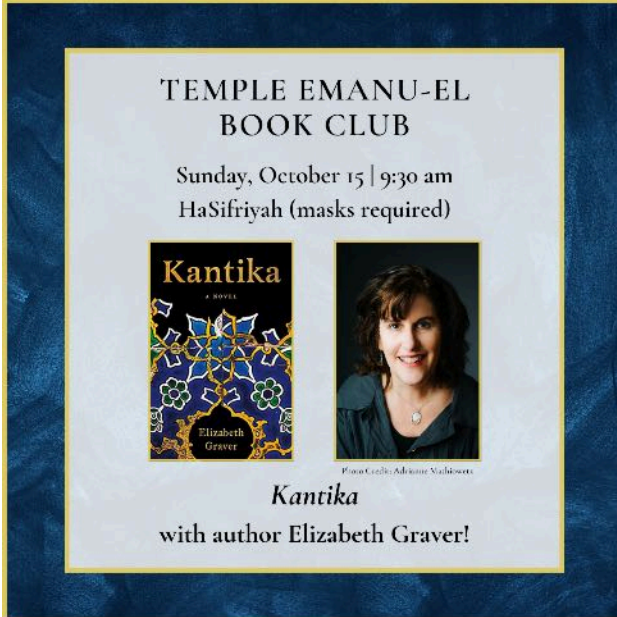

At Temple Emanu-El, these plaques are lit on the yahrzeit, or anniversary of death, and for Yizkor services.

Plaques are inscribed with the name of the deceased in both English and Hebrew as well as the date of the person's death. They are available to view whenever the sanctuary is open.

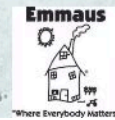

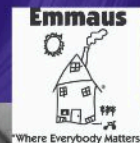
