Dear chevre,

There is a midrash that I love from the Talmud,* on B'midbar 7:9, that notices a repetition in the Torah text. We are told that "to the children of Kehat, [Moses] gave nothing, because on them was holy work, lifted on their shoulders." The midrash asks: if the text already says that the work was "on their shoulders," why the seemingly extraneous word "lifted?" Citing proof texts from Psalms and Isaiah where the word *lift* is connected to the act of

singing (raising voices, raising a song), it answers by saying that in this verse, *lifted* signifies that the b'nei Kehat were singing. Song can lift burdens, and song can raise Torah.

Song can organize our muscle movements, help us move in a rhythm for a repetitive task, and synchronize large groups of people for efficiency. Song can focus and express emotion. Song turns work into pleasure and empowers us to connect ethically and empathetically with one another.

When we could not meet in person, communal song waned. Our burdens, unlifted by song, got heavier. Being able to sing again, live with other humans, has often moved me to tears of gratitude this past year. It is irreplaceable. To gather in our sanctuary and share song is a gift once more within our reach.

This month, there are two particular services where the sound of our combined voices will lift us all. At our tricongregational Tisha b'Av in Andover on Saturday, August 6, the music of our Megillat Eicha, our choir, and our traditional Ma'ariv melodies are poised to both express and lift the heaviness of destruction, exile, and self-betrayal and help us explore Jewish resilience. Six days later, Rabbi Micah Shapiro will lead us in a singing-out Shabbat "Nariya" evening service on Friday, August 12, sponsored by our Music Committee. Come sing together. Let's lift up holiness through song and enjoy one another's presence.

When we could not meet in person, communal song waned. Our burdens, unlifted by song, got heavier. Being able to sing again, live with other humans, has often moved me to tears of gratitude this past year.

On both the saddest day of the Jewish year and on its most common and most joyful holiday, our song has work to do.







Plaques are inscribed with the name of the deceased in both English and Hebrew as well as the date of the person's death. They are available to view whenever the sanctuary is open.
