Weekly Parashah Study



Dear chevre,

I feel honored, blessed, and excited to be returning to Temple Emanu-El as your new rabbi. When I began to write, I looked back to the first bulletin article I wrote as your rabbinic intern in 2019. I wrote about firsts and expressed gratitude for the opportunity to experience many firsts with

all of you. Although that theme still feels appropriate, I now find myself thinking more about what it means to return to a place after a long journey.

Recently I read *The Hobbit, or There and Back Again* to my youngest child. The classic fantasy novel follows Bilbo Baggins, the hobbit of the title, as he travels with the wizard Gandalf and thirteen dwarves on a quest to reclaim the dwarves' home and treasure from the dragon Smaug. At the beginning of

the story, Bilbo lives a quiet, peaceful, and comfortable life in his home under the hill (his hobbit hole). When Bilbo travels with Gandalf and the dwarves, the group navigates through many adventures and mishaps. After they accomplish their mission, Bilbo returns home, accompanied by Gandalf. Upon first seeing his homeland after the yearlong journey, Bilbo breaks into verse and Gandalf responds with surprise, "My dear Bilbo! Something is the matter with you! You are not the hobbit that you were." I disagree somewhat with Gandalf's assessment of Bilbo. I do not feel that anything is the matter with Bilbo; however, he is not exactly the same hobbit that he was at the beginning of the tale. The journey and all Bilbo encountered along the way have transformed him.

I recalled Gandalf's words as I anticipated my return to Temple Emanu-EI. I began my relationship with the community at the end of my first year of rabbinical school. During my internship, I learned new skills and felt blessed by the relationships which started to form. At the end of that year, I continued my rabbinical school journey at Hebrew College. Much like Bilbo the hobbit, I had my own share of adventures, mishaps, and successes along the way. As I approached the end of five years of study, when I could see ordination on the horizon and had accepted the offer to serve as your rabbi, I realized that I was not exactly the same rabbinical student that I had been when I first met Temple Emanu-EI. Just as Bilbo was shaped by his journey with Gandalf and the dwarves, I have been shaped by the past five years of learning.

Like Bilbo, I am the same person, but I also recognize that I have grown through my adventures. I am excited to share some of my story with you over the months and years to come.

One of the many adventures which shaped me was the intensive study of our sacred texts. I hope to have many opportunities to explore and learn texts with you! As I reflected on returning to Temple Emanu-El and renewing our relationships, a teaching from the Babylonian Talmud came to mind. In Tractate Berakhot 58b, Rabbi Yehoshua ben Levi teaches what blessing to say when encountering a friend for the first time in more than a year. He says that one should say "Blessed are You, Adonai our God, who revives the dead."

Before email, social media, or telephones, if you had not seen or heard from a friend for twelve months, you had no way of knowing if your friend was even alive. By contrast, with modern technology, knowing about our friends and family requires very little effort. We can connect by tapping a button or a screen. In fact, we can check on our loved ones without even talking to each other. Social media such as Facebook or Instagram allow us to share small glimpses of our lives with each other. I have been delighted to stay in touch with some of the Temple Emanu-El community in this way.

Despite this ability to connect on a surface level, that is, to know that we are each still alive, Rabbi Yehoshua ben Levi's teaching still resonates with me. Seeing a friend after such a long time is absolutely a moment which should be celebrated!

When we rekindle friendships, we put life back into those relationships and into each other. My goal for this first year as your rabbi is to connect with as many members of the congregation as possible. Whether you knew me as your intern or are meeting me for the first time, I invite you to reach out—by email, by phone, or in person—so that we can get to know one another and so that you can share with me your personal hopes, worries, and dreams for the congregation.

Although I feel I am coming home to Temple Emanu-EI, I also feel that we are embarking on a new journey together. Like Bilbo, we will have many adventures with good companions. May we also find some treasures: the blessings of holy learning, sacred relationships, and joyful moments along the way. I am so looking forward to beginning this new chapter in the life of Temple Emanu-EI with you!










Honor Your Father and Your Mother

It is a widely observed Jewish tradition to commemorate the passing of a loved one by memorializing those that have departed with a yahrzeit plaque on a dedicated memorial wall.

At Temple Emanu-El, these plaques are lit on the yahrzeit, or anniversary of death, and for Yizkor services.

Plaques are inscribed with the name of the deceased in both English and Hebrew as well as the date of the person's death. They are available to view whenever the sanctuary is open.
