Weekly Parasha Study



Dear chevre,

Although this is the March bulletin, I can't help but think of it as THE Adar bulletin because Adar Rishon will end and Adar Sheni will begin during our secular month of March. Just hearing about the month of Adar always reminds me of the rabbinic teaching, "Mi she-nichnas Adar, marbin b'simcha," when we enter Adar, we

increase in joy. Being told how to feel bothers me, so I take my emotional reaction to that directive as an opportunity to think about how else I might understand the instruction to "increase in joy."

Two possible alternatives to increasing my own feelings of joy come to mind. First, I can understand the instruction to "increase in joy" as a suggestion to look intentionally for joyful everyday moments. Looking for joy can be difficult, given the prevalence of negative news we are exposed to on a daily basis. Choosing to look for joy requires us to shift our focus to what is not always as easy to see or what we might consider small.

How might your experience of the world change if you committed yourself to recognizing at least three happy or joyful moments in each day?

The second possible way to understand "increase in joy" is to focus on increasing the joy of others. Similar to looking for joy, increasing the joy of others also can be challenging if we ourselves don't already feel particularly joyful. However, numerous scientific studies have shown that happiness comes from making other people feel better.

Purim, coming at the end of this month, offers at least four ways to increase in joy through creating joyful moments and by helping other people feel better. The four mitzvot, sacred obligations, of Purim are: mishloach manot (sending gifts), mikra megillah (reading the Book of Esther), seudat Purim (festive meal), and matanot laEvyonim (gifts to those in need). Temple Emanu-El will be fulfilling each of these mitzvot throughout March/Adar, and I invite you to participate in each of them. On Sunday March 17 at 9:00 am, the Chesed Committee will bake hamantaschen and make food packages to send to older members of our community, especially those who are homebound. On that same morning, our religious school families also will make hamantaschen for their own mishloach manot to give to friends and family.

On Saturday March 23 at 6:00 pm, we will celebrate Purim as a whole community with the reading of the Megillah, the Book of Esther, as well as by singing, dancing, dressing up as pop stars and athletes, and enjoying food together. Throughout the month of March/Adar, I encourage you to fulfill the mitzvah of matanot laEvyonim, gifts to those in need, by donating to Yad Chessed. Yad Chessed is a charitable Jewish organization in Brookline, Massachusetts; they distribute 80% of the funds that are donated on Purim day, in the form of kosher market vouchers, so that those who struggle with financial hardship can buy food, celebrate the holiday, and feel connected to the Jewish community. The other 20% are used throughout the year to assist Jews in need. Last but not least, we will continue to celebrate Purim on Sunday March 24 at 10:30 am with our annual Purim Carnival.

In addition to all of the Purim programs, you'll find many other opportunities to strengthen your relationship and experience joy with Temple Emanu-El this month. You can find out about all of the Temple Emanu-El happenings on the temple website and our weekly emails, and many of the events are in this bulletin. Throughout this March/Adar, let's make "Mi she-nichnas Adar, marbin b'simcha" a reality by recognizing and creating joyful moments together in our holy community.










Honor Your Father and Your Mother


It is a widely observed Jewish tradition to commemorate the passing of a loved one by memorializing those that have departed with a yahrzeit plague on a dedicated memorial wall.

At Temple Emanu-El, these plaques are lit on the yahrzeit, or anniversary of death, and for Yizkor services.

Plaques are inscribed with the name of the deceased in both English and Hebrew as well as the date of the person's death. They are available to view whenever the sanctuary is open.
















Avoid Email Scams (Phishing)


Examine all emails carefully:

- Are they asking you to take an unusual action?
- Are there unexpected links or attachments?

If you are unsure about an email:

- Don't click on any links.
- Don't open attachments.

- Block the sender, or mark the email as junk.
- Delete the email from your computer.
